

The Millennium Park Project

will add approximately 52 hectares to the existing municipal greenspace in the heart of Powell River and will:

Preserve the historic Willingdon Beach Trail for the enjoyment of the community, including the conservation of First Nations heritage sites.



Provide opportunity for students in the community and all visitors from the world to learn about forest and stream ecosystems through the installation of interpretive signs and viewing platforms along the salmon streams.



Provide a forested buffer for protecting McGuffie and McFall Creeks which will be rehabilitated for salmon.



Create a forest garden easily accessible to all citizens.



Construct wheelchair accessible trails in the park and links to upland trails to provide access into the forest for people of all ages and abilities.
